
Book Reviews




This **is Mark Webber's** story to date - told in his own straight talking Aussie way he reveals his exciting and intriguing life on and off the race track. From his early days of karting to his first appearance for Minardi at the Australian Grand Prix and subsequently his time with Red Bull with all the controversy of his relationship with Sebastian Vettle bubbling beneath the surface. Searingly honest, he tells the inside story of this and many other battles he fought to maintain his motor racing career.

Many are of the opinion that he deserved to be F1 world champion - but it was not to be. However, since leaving Formula One Mark has achieved considerable success with endurance racing including the legendary Le Mans 24 Hour race.

Sir Jackie Stewart provides a foreword for the book in which he underscores the determination and commitment by Mark to the sport of motor racing.

Author **Jonathon Wood** has received the Guild of Motoring Writers' Montague Trophy and the Society of Automotive Historians' Cugnot Award for his work which includes thirty-five books on motoring including in particular the histories of Britain's many car manufacturers.

Although small in size this book gives an in depth analysis of the rise and fall of a motoring legend - MG.

Examining the various models in detail, Jonathon covers the financial and corporate traumas which afflicted the company, its brief resurgence in 1995 with the MGF and the final sad chapter which saw MG sold off to foreign investors.
