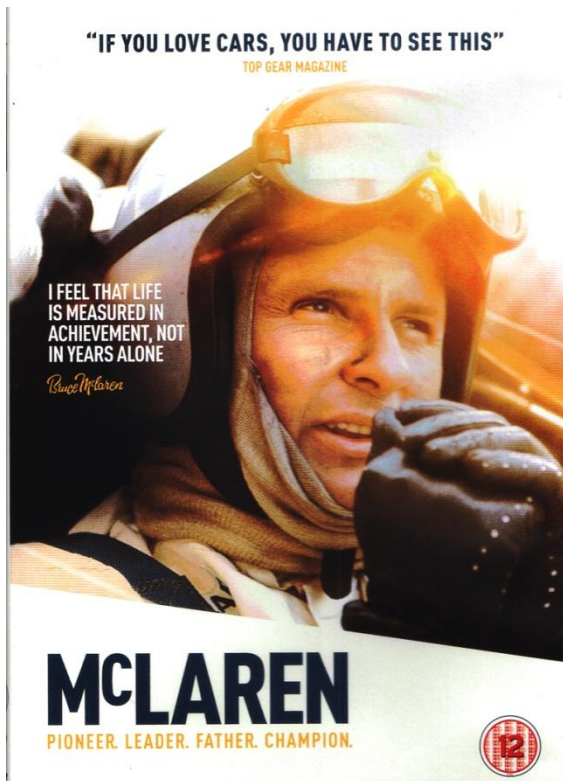


# DVD and Book Review



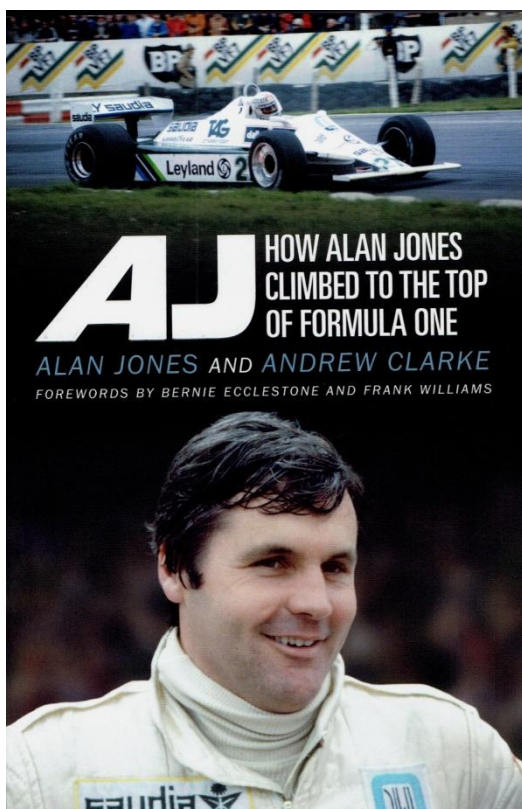
